Before colonization, Indigenous communities across Canada were wholly self-sufficient and selfgoverning, making decisions in the best interest of their people. In 2005, after more than a decade of negotiations and referendums, the Westbank First Nation (WFN) Self-Governance Act came into force, marking the official return to community-based self-governance. Today, WFN is one of the most progressive and successful with continuous growth in the number of businesses—both Indigenous and non-Indigenous owned—and developments on its lands in the Central Okanagan.



A few years prior to achieving selfgovernance, WFN created the first Indigenous Economic Development Commission (EDC) in Canada, which prioritizes business retention, Indigenous communities in Canada, facilitation, and attraction, while also advising its Council. Thanks to its robust infrastructure, governance controls, decision-making power, and Land Title Insurance, WFN is a winning choice for investors. The community works collaboratively to manage its more than 5,000 acres of reserve lands and protect its resources, environments, and watersheds, looking to drive prosperity for future generations.

Sharon's dedication and hard work have been recognized with awards including National Aboriginal Capital Corporation Businesswoman of the Year in 2020. Kekuli Café honors Indigenous heritage while providing a welcoming space for all, ensuring a lasting legacy.

NICHE WINE CO.

Niche Wine Co., nestled in the scenic hills of West Kelowna in the Central Okanagan, epitomizes a deep-rooted connection to the land and community. Founded by James and Joanna Schlosser, the winery embodies a philosophy where wine is grown, not just made. With multigeneration farming heritage and Indigenous ancestry, their approach to winemaking reflects a commitment to sustainability and seventhgeneration thinking.

Their award-winning wines and integrated tasting room offer guests an authentic behind-the-scenes experience. Support from the community has been instrumental in the winery's growth and success, and has helped them through challenges like the devastating

2023 wildfires. Diversifying with sustainable initiatives and agri-tourism experiences, Niche Wine Co. exemplifies a holistic approach to winemaking, rooted in family, sustainability, and community.
